High School and Junior High

- Apply2College Day was held on October 11 and 18 and it was a success! So far, 46 college applications have been submitted by the senior class.
- Senior parents The FAFSA will open sometime in December for students who plan to attend college during the 2024-25 school year. The FAFSA is used to award scholarships, grants, and student loans. A representative from EducationQuest came to speak with parents and students on Thursday, October 12 about the FAFSA. If you were not able to attend, but would like information please let me know.

Just a reminder, make sure create your FSA ID (parents and student) so you are prepared once the application opens. You will need to allow several days for the verification process once the ID is created.

- Senior parents A representative from EducationQuest will return to DPS on Thursday, February 8 for FAFSA Completion Day. The purpose of this day is to help parents and students with the FAFSA application. Individual times will be available for parents and students to meet with the representative for assistance.
- Senior parents Scholarship Workshop will be held on Thursday, November 16 at 6:30 p.m. This workshop will help provide information as parents and students begin to search and apply for scholarships. More information will be mailed to parents in the near future.
- Junior parents College Information Night will be held on Wednesday, November 8 at 6:30 p.m. This event is to help junior parents and students start to think about different topics prior to their senior year. A flier with more information will be sent in the mail prior to this event.

Working Well With Others Is A Vital Skill For School And Life

There's a lot to be said for encouraging children to show leadership. But, let's face it—some kids are just plain bossy. They won't take turns. They won't share. They won't listen to what anyone says.

In school and life, your child will be expected to work with others. So, whether there is a group project in social studies or a student council meeting, your child needs to know how to cooperate.

To reinforce this skill:

- · Allow family members to take turns making decisions for everyone—from which movie to watch this weekend to what to have for dinner.
- Establish basic house rules. For example, if one child chooses the game, the other gets the first turn.
- Teach fair ways to make decisions. Have your children play "rock, paper, scissors" to see who gets on the computer first. Flip a coin to decide who takes the first bath.
- Talk about the importance of being open-minded and respectful of other people's ideas, opinions and perspectives.
- Offer praise when your child thinks of others, "That was nice of you to let your brother pick the cookie he wanted first."


