
### Chess Club Organized



#### Swing Choir Was Formed






Swing Choir also performed at school concerts, open house, churches, a Crete reception, baccalaureate, and commencement. The group received an "excellent" rating at District Music Contest.

The speaker for the evening was Mr. Larry Ribble.



The 1971 football team produced the first Conference championship since 1959 and the first Pioneer title since Dorchester joined the Conference three years ago. The squad was the third undefeated team in Dorchester's history.

The Longhorns averaged 27 points

per game while allowing only 7 points from their opponents.

Coach Guggenmos and the eleven seniors, who were the backbone of the team, compiled a 29-5-2 record in their four years together. This included a string of 16 straight victories.


#### In The Fall

The reserves won all but one of their games, so the future looks bright for the Longhorn volleyball team.













Sunday morning's departure time came all too soon.















Commencement exercises were held May 15 for twenty-four seniors. Pat Kalkwarf and Marlene Matejka gave the salutatory and valedictory speeches.


