In conclusion, we hope you know these were a fantasy. We are sure each one of us will succeed in our own separate way.

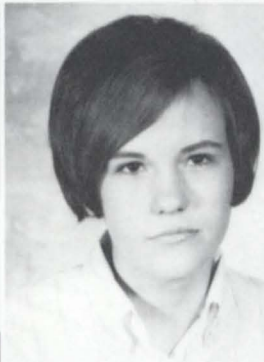
