Good luck to each of you.

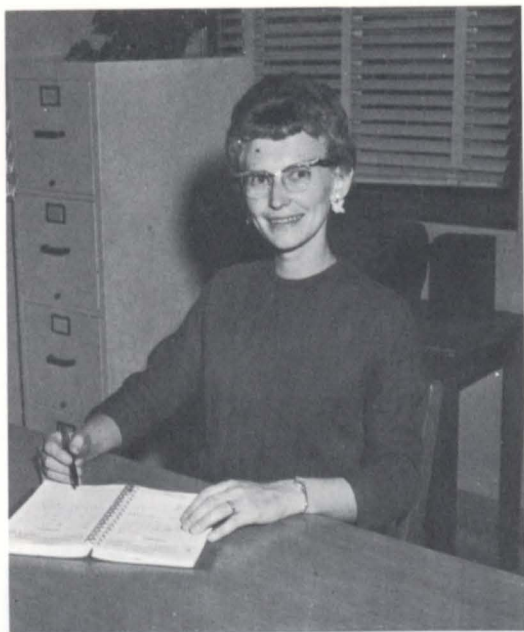

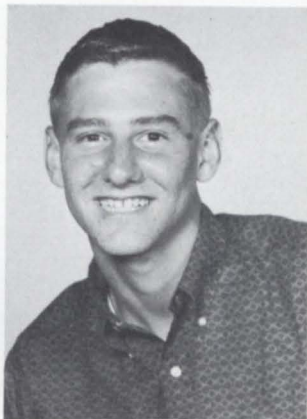
This is the ocean we will be required to cross, and will need the attributes which I have mentioned as I spelled out the word.

My hope is that each senior member, as we depart tonight as a class of 1965, will cross this ocean with success.

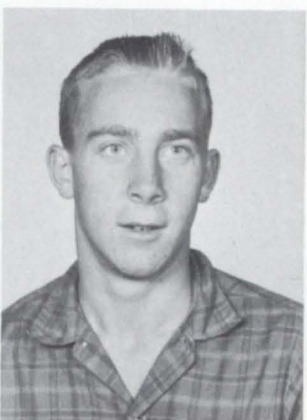

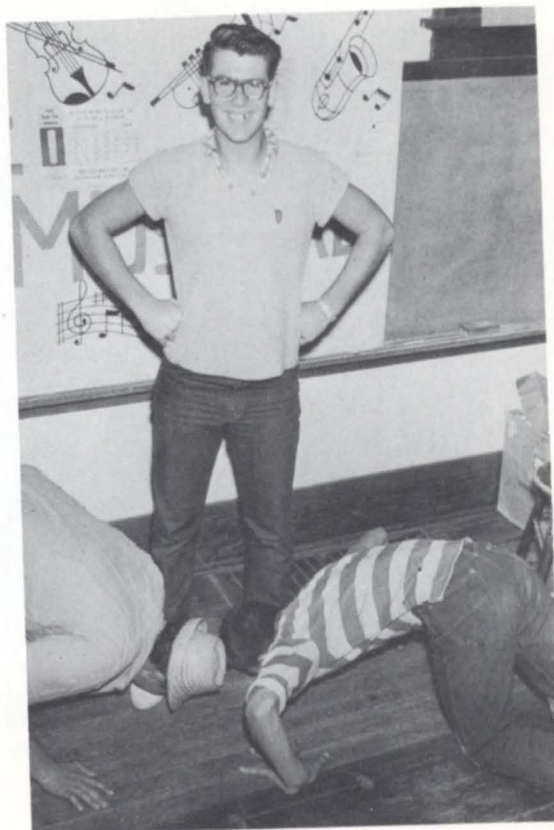
WILDERED NEW FACES

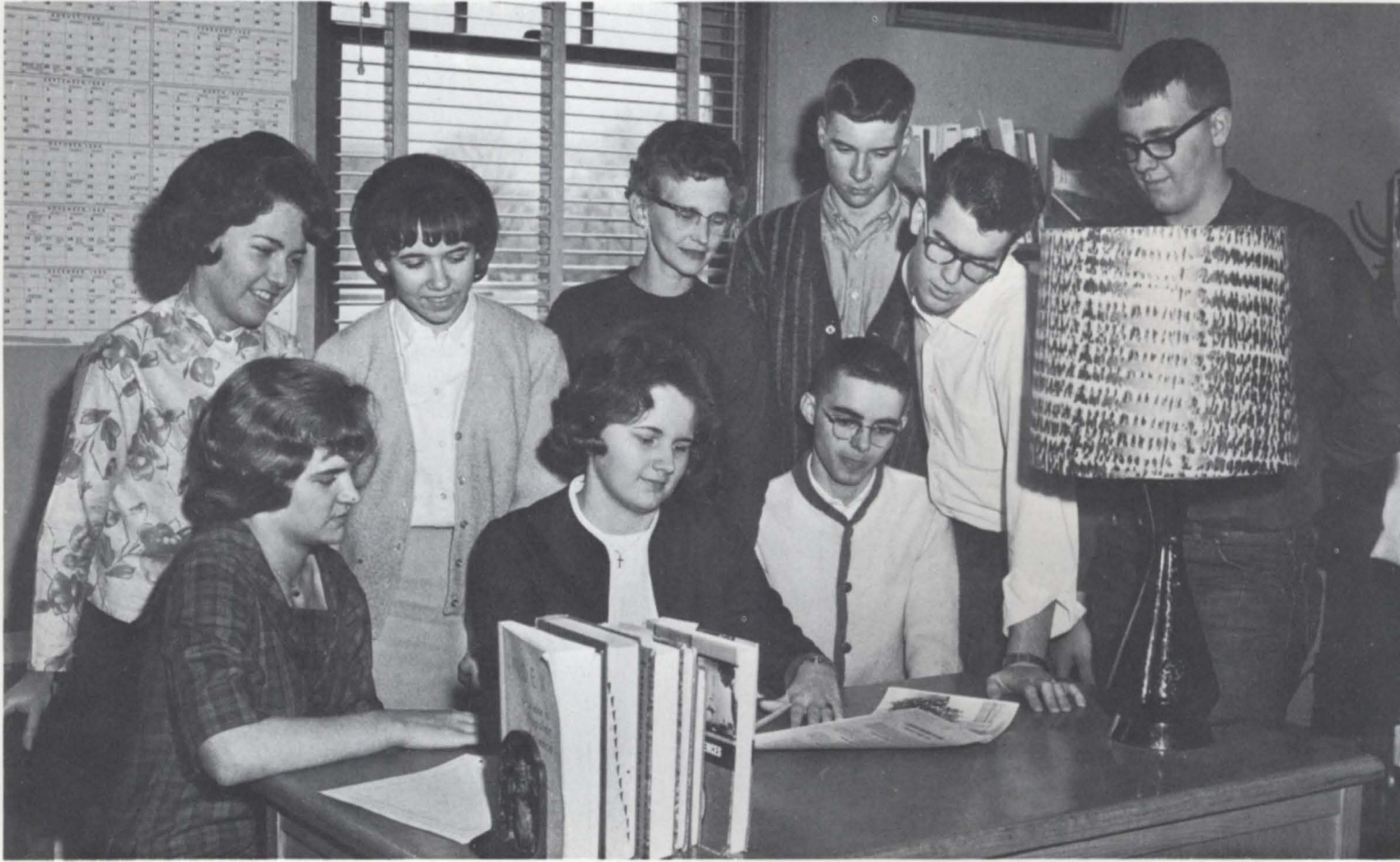


State qualifier Dale Feeken showing form on the high hurdles.
